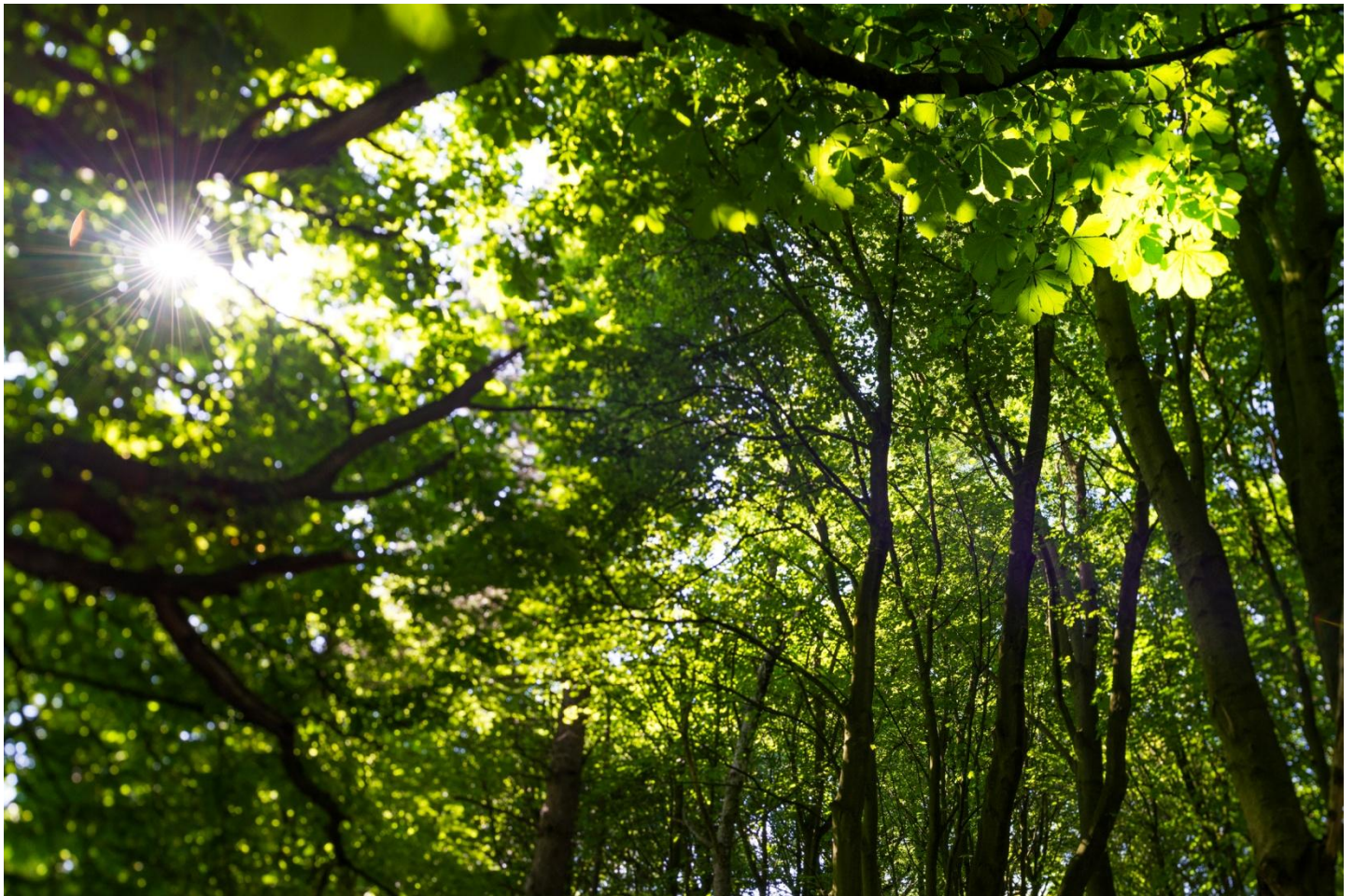

News

Canal Management

Work has begun to complete Phase 1 of our Canal Management Plan to ensure the long term well being of the stretch of the canal owned and managed by the Council. We have worked closely with the Lancaster Canal Trust and Alistair Hearn, our Woodland Management Consultant. Our application to the SLDC Environmental Partnership Fund for a grant of £2,674 has been successful and will go towards the costs associated with this phase which entails the removal of the multi stemmed trees which have self seeded within the canal basin. This work is the minimum required in order to prevent those trees causing further deterioration of the canal habitat and erosion to the towpath. Our contractor is James Park who has carried out work for us in the past. The work has been divided into several stages to minimise inconvenience to users but we ask for everyone's patience while work is being carried out. If you have any queries, please contact us.

Following a successful ballot of residents, we are able to press on with the launch of our SEDGWICK NO COLD CALLING ZONE. Trading Standards have provided signs and information to assist us with this project.

Funding and Grants Following our successful bid for “transparency funding” earlier this year, we have a new computer and printer, to improve the way we work. We are also delighted to be able to provide the Village Hall with free broadband and wi-fi, a great benefit to users of the hall. We are also very pleased to be able to help the Cricket Club with their ambitious ongoing project to replace their practice nets, by providing a grant of £1500. The Cricket Club are a real asset to village and their continued hard work deserves to be supported.

Millennium Field Our new outdoor fitness equipment has been a great success. It is great to see adults enjoying the equipment alongside children using their play equipment. However, it has highlighted the lack of equipment for those in the middle. So, the council have decided to fill this gap by installing a basketball hoop and five-a-side type goal posts. We hope all our older children and younger adults enjoy them!

Bonfires We have recently been asked about bonfires... Whilst there are no laws against them, we ask everyone to consider their neighbours when lighting up. There is good general guidance online - see link below which includes useful advice about avoiding days such as bank holidays, or those with poor air quality or variable wind, which substances and materials should not be burnt and other safety information.

So, the Village Hall Committee need to appoint a new officer this year

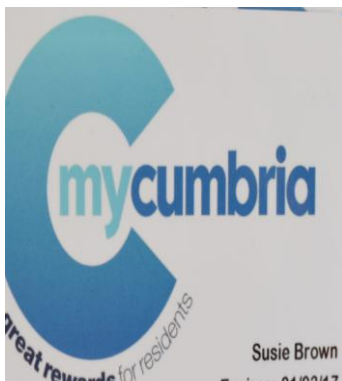
