

WELCOME

We start our newsletter by paying tribute to Sylvia Roberts, our outgoing Parish Clerk who has retired after serving the Parish as Clerk for 8 years. In this time, in addition to expertly guiding the council, managing Parish affairs, and keeping us on the straight and narrow, she has driven many projects and supported many initiatives. Since she started, we have installed the outdoor gym, toddler slide, benches and picnic tables, acquired grants to deal with ash die back and just recently, to install our new bus shelter using funding from Cumbria County Council. During the pandemic, she also coordinated our much-appreciated community support. We thank her for her dedicated work, wish her well in her retirement and feel sure she will keep in touch with the many friends she has made in the Parish.

We have successfully recruited a new clerk, Rachel Harrison, who has taken on the role with great enthusiasm and is already very much part of the team. We warmly welcome her to Sedgwick and look forward to working with her.

Our **Annual Parish Meeting** was well attended. The Parish Council, District and County Councillors and Village Organisations gave their annual reports and The Clean River Kent Campaign delivered a presentation about the vital work they are doing to monitor the river and campaign to make it clean and safe. Our new Unitary Authority, Westmorland and Furness have replaced SLDC and CCC which covers from Alston in northeast, to Walney Island in the southwest and includes the towns of Barrow, Kendal and Penrith. Sedgwick is in the South Kendal Ward. Their focus has been on making sure that essential services such as collecting bins and recycling, planning, highways, schools and social care have continued. Canal Wildlife Area: We are very sorry to have to report that the vandalism along the canal towpath has increased. Our signs are being regularly uprooted and hidden and recently one was removed and replaced upside down. In May, the Stoker Seat was damaged and when repairs were made, they were unscrewed and removed, presumably by the person causing the damage. The damage is now so bad that we are having to replace the chair. Repairs have also been required to mend a broken fence rail and a section of stone wall has been pushed over. The Local Police are involved and have recommended we install CCTV cameras to help identify who is causing damage. In this current year, this pointless vandalism has already cost 10% of our annual budget (excluding repairs to the wall) and consequently we are facing difficult decisions about other areas of the budget.

The Millennium Field: Unfortunately, there have also been incidents of vandalism at the Millennium Field. The goalposts have been wrecked and parts stolen, and some of the signage has been uprooted and taken. Again, the expenditure required to replace these items, means we have even less to spend on other things. Otherwise, the field is very busy and much appreciated. Our Free Compost Scheme is in full flow – please continue to use the compost in the concrete bunker in the corner.
